## Social Distance and Social Stratification

This CFP was last updated 31 July 2013

Our annual conference will be taking place on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> September at the HSPS faculty (Department of Sociology), University of Cambridge <a href="http://www.hsps.cam.ac.uk/">http://www.hsps.cam.ac.uk/</a>>.

The conference theme will be 'Social Distance and Social Stratification'.

Our theme this year concerns the way in which social connections and interactions between people are linked to social stratification. We are particularly interested in papers that explore the concept of social distance and its relation to social inequality in empirical or theoretical terms. Our theme reflects that the seminar this year is sponsored by the ESRC project 'Is Britain Pulling Apart? Analysis of Generational Change in Social Distance'. Accordingly the seminar programme will incorporate a short symposium of papers presenting empirical research from that project (also see <a href="www.camsis.stir.ac.uk/pullingapart">www.camsis.stir.ac.uk/pullingapart</a>). We particularly welcome submissions of papers that engage with similar themes, both in terms of substance (e.g. social distance between occupations, educational experiences, lifestyle and leisure patterns, values and opinions), and in terms of methodology (e.g. measures and models of social interaction processes or social networks).

Paper presentations: Papers are encouraged that engage with the conference theme, but all papers in the broad area of stratification and inequality will be considered. Our seminar has a tradition of featuring papers with robust empirical foundations and so, as usual, we particularly welcome papers which have this quality, such as by using large-scale survey data, although this is not a prerequisite. We do not anticipate limiting the number of delegates attending, but we do expect to have to enforce an upper limit on the number of paper presentations that we can accommodate. If you would like to present a paper, please send a title and short description of your paper (at least 100 words) to Paul Lambert by 15<sup>th</sup> July 2013 paul.lambert@stirling.ac.uk (updated deadline). Confirmation of papers for presentation will be made by 19<sup>th</sup> July 2013.
